Stonehenge

- Located in Amesbury, Wiltshire, U.K.
- Comprised of about 100 massive upward standing stones placed in the shape of a circle
- Scientists are baffled by how exactly this impressive monument was constructed and believe that it was once used as a burial ground



Buckingham Palace

- Located in London, U.K.
- The official London home of the Queen and has been the residence for the the British Monarchy since 1837



London Eye

- Located in London, U.K.
- 135 meters tall which makes it the tallest ferris wheel in all of Europe
- There is a total of 32 capsules and each has a capacity of 25 people
- Has views of up to 40 kilometers in all directions



Big Ben

- Located in London, U.K.
- Was built after the Palace of Westminster was destroyed by a fire in 1834
- The government decided that the new houses of Parliament should include a tower with a clock



Blenheim Palace

- Located in Woodstock, Oxfordshire, U.K.
- Built to honor John Churchill, the 1st Duke of Marlborough
- 200 years after it was built, served as the birthplace of Winston Churchill



Bodiam Castle

- Located in Bodiam, Robertsbridge, East Sussex, U.K.
- Built by Sir Edward Dalyngriggle in 1385
